


- ► The American public has nuanced, often ambivalent feelings about the issue of abortion
- ► Majorities support the legality of abortion but also think it is morally wrong and oppose tax dollars to pay for abortion

Methodology: Catholic Democrats averaged the results of surveys on the legality and morality of abortion conducted by the Pew Research Center and the Public Religion Institute (PRRI) in 2013 to obtain more representative results. This was the most recent year when both survey organizations asked the same questions on both the legality and morality of abortion. **Data Source:** See Data Table.

Note: For comparison purposes, data from late 2015 and 2016 is included in the data table. Based on the data used for the graph, there is a 28.5% difference between the spreads for abortion legality and morality. Based on the 2015/2016 data - from different survey organizations - that difference would be 36%. This strongly suggests that views on the legality and morality of abortion have held stable and that the data presented is not overstated.
